Between October 1, 2008 and December 31, 2009, the Amy Foundation provided funding for 457 screening mammograms to uninsured patients at Saint Peter's University Hospital. According to our records, 71 of these patients required follow-up diagnostic/ultrasound mammograms. We are happy to report that none of these patients received a diagnosis of breast cancer.
